



2022 Important Health & Protection Equine Protocols

To ensure overall health and well-being of all horses entering and leaving Flintfields Horse Park, the following three documents must accompany every horse entering the facility.

This policy will begin on June 4, 2022 and remain throughout the entirety of the 2022 season.

Upon entry, the following three forms must be provided and examined by individual at gate upon horse's entry to showgrounds:

1. An Interstate or Intrastate Health Certificate (CVI) from origin and signed by USDA accredited veterinarian
2. USEF Declaration of Health form signed by owner/trainer indicating no fevers or disease within horse(s) in the past 72 hours.

After receipt and confirmation of health documents, gate personnel will confirm the number of horses entering the property to ensure the paperwork corresponds with the number on the transport. If the paperwork is not present, or if the paperwork does not properly correspond to the number of horses on board, the transport will be delayed entry until the horse show veterinarians can examine the horse(s).

3. The third required document is a Certificate of Influenza/ Herpes (Flu/ Rhino) Vaccination form signed by a licensed veterinarian. This certificate should include:
 - Horse(s) show name
 - Date of last vaccination
 - Product name

This form will be collected as a hard copy by show office personnel to be kept on record. If a hard copy is not delivered to the show office, no show number(s) will be issued. There will be absolutely no exceptions.

Horse(s) must arrive between 8am - 7pm to be admitted to the showgrounds. Should arrival fall outside of these hours, or without paperwork, horse(s) will have to be examined by veterinarians, and a charge for an emergency/after-hours fee and health certificate fee for examination of the horse(s) and transport will be applicable.
